AAMP Output III: Targeted Commitments "Who Should Do What, Where and When". The Scope and duties of Chairs

AAMP Facilitator Reference Group I & II Chairs Clusters I to 7 Co-Chairs

Resources, Principles and Processes

- a) Chairs will at all times be supported by the technical and administration services from the NAMC, BFAP and CCRED.
- b) Chairs should review the record of the meetings and sign-off if they are satisfied that these were a true reflection of the discussions.
- c) Chairs also need to bracket those areas that require further discussion or resolution.
- d) Chairs of Reference Groups I and 2 should from time to time confer on the progress of the negotiations in various Clusters and exchange. information. Some of these meetings will be convened by the Facilitator.
- e) Negotiations at each cluster should be inclusive and managed in a manner that allows Social Partners to participate effectively and in a constructive manner.
- f) Negotiations should focus on and be guided by, the key principles, supported by scientifically based evidence and research that has been set out in the broader agreement and the Action Plan and try to reach consensus on targeted commitments
- Ensure technical support is available for all clusters and reference groups.
- Provide support to Reference Groups chairs and draft the negotiation plan and scheduling of meetings. Also ensure all Social Partners receive meeting invites and negotiation packs in reasonable times to prepare for the negotiations.
- Collect and elevate issues requiring unblocking by the Executive Oversight Committee.
- Ensure integration of negotiations between Reference Group I and II.
- Interact with commodity groups to obtain any information required to support the masterplan commitment.

Support the facilitator of the AAMP in managing the negotiations process across the cluster-streams and ensure these adhere to the agreed-upon agenda and time-lines. This also means guarding against going over the line.

Support cluster chairs in brokering agreements or achieving consensus.

Elevate difficult issues/deadlocks from each cluster to the facilitator for his attention.

Communicate the final outcomes of the reference group to the facilitator for tabling at the Executive Committee.

Ensure cluster negotiations are conducted in a fair, transparent and collaborative manner and that acceptable resolutions are reach on

Communicate the final outcomes of the cluster to the overall Chair of the Reference Group.

Elevate challenges from each cluster to the overall Chair of the Reference Group.

Coordinate and aggregate the commitments and targets from all Social Partners participating in the cluster.

Ensure cluster negotiations are conducted in a fair, transparent and collaborative manner and resolutions are reach on a consensus basis.

Ensure the negotiations of each cluster are set up in the manner that allows Social Partners to participate effectively and orderly manner.

Background on Master Plans and Priority Economic Sectors

- I. In February 2019, President Ramaphosa identify 7 strategic and priority sectors, agriculture and agroprocessing is one of them. Also announced that these 7 priority sectors will formulate their Master Plans.
- 2. In March 2020, Minister Didiza appointed the NAMC to coordinate the research, consultation and development of the Agriculture and Agro-processing Master Plan on behalf of Department of Agriculture, Land Reform and Rural Development in consultation with industry, labour and communities.
- 3. The NAMC works closely with BFAP and CCRED in coordinating and developing the Agriculture and Agroprocessing Master Plan (AAMP).
- 4. The AAMP recognize and aligns to finalized commodity specific Master Plans (e.g. sugar, poultry and cannabis) and well as other sectoral plans (e.g. Textile and Clothing, ICT, Manufacturing est.).




