- <u>Key Priorities:</u> **Transformation**, market access, government & stakeholder relations, and information management & communication













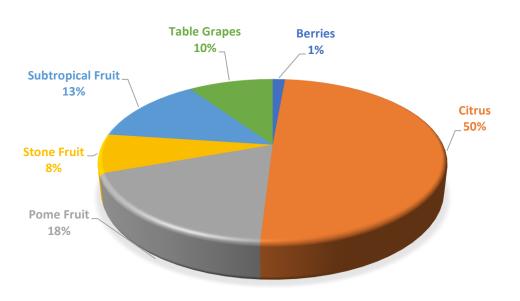


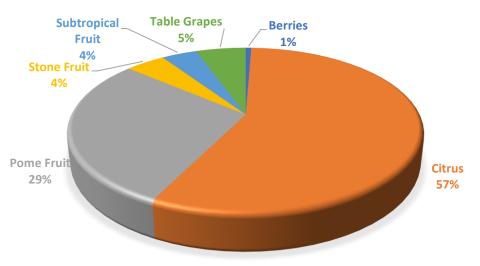
South African fruit production

Tons Produced = 6 230 372











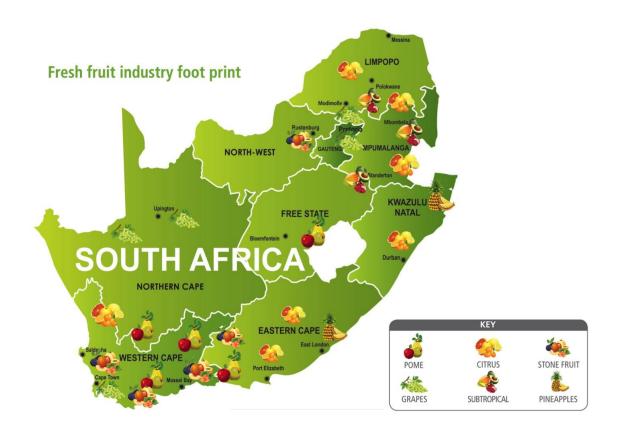






Fruit growing regions in SA

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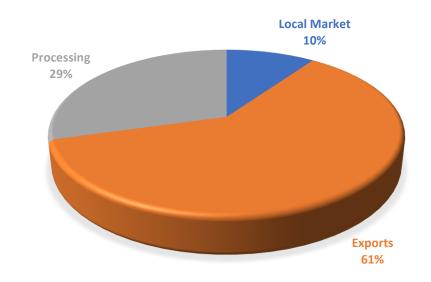




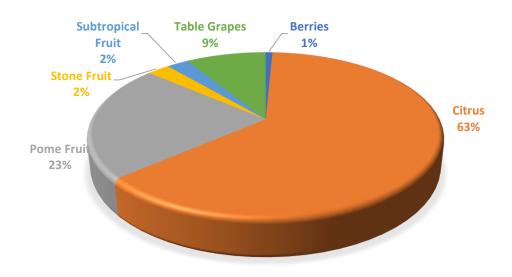

100 export destinations







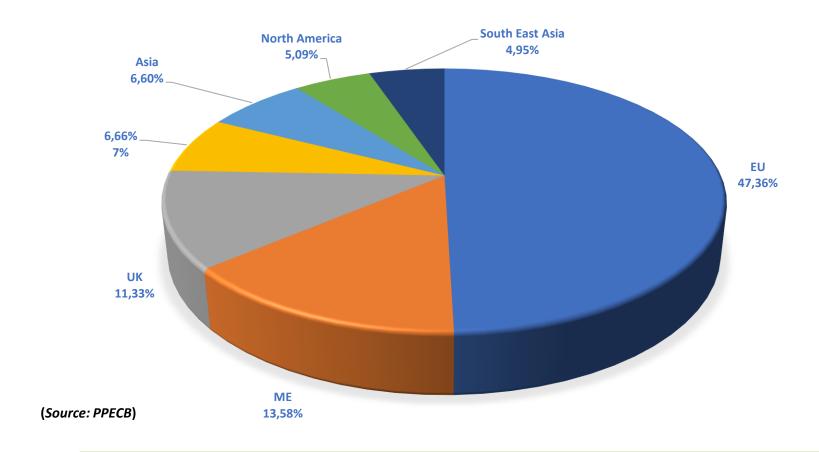






Export destinations











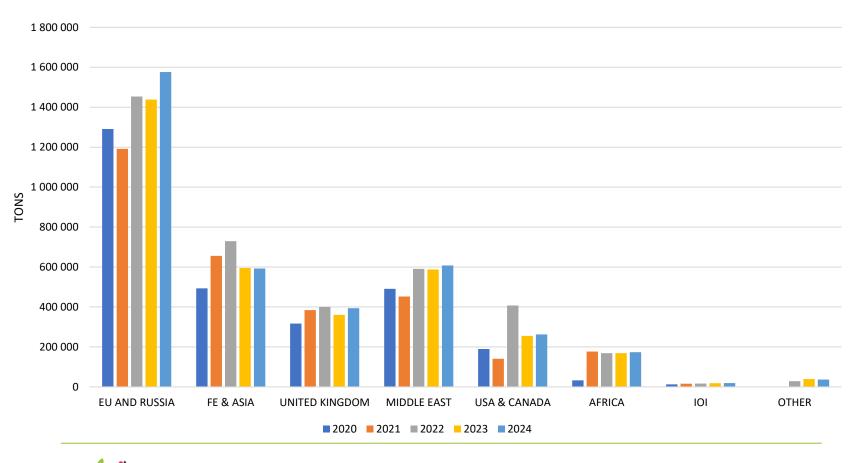






Export destinations – 5-year trend













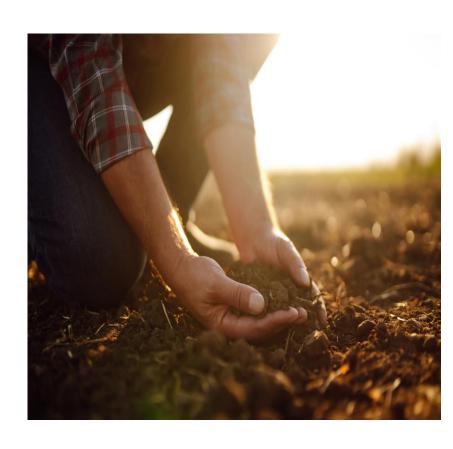




Significance of the South African fruit industry



- Industry value = R86.7 bn
- 320 387 on-farm jobs (FTE); 1 279 556 dependents
- Social contribution: on-farm housing, basic health-care, school programmes etc.
- **35**% of SA's agricultural exports
- Projected to grow by 35% in the next few years (2032)
- Largest **SH** exporter by volume = 44%















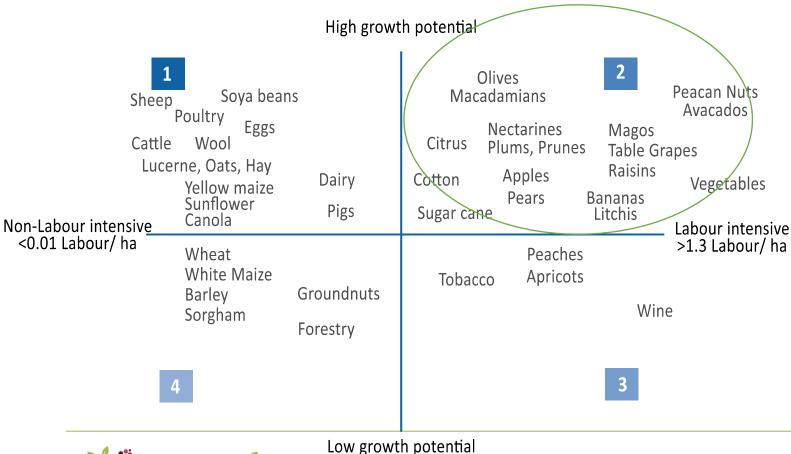

- Infrastructure constraints vs industry growth
- Rising production costs
- Geo-politics
- High tariffs
- Effects of climate change
- Declining consumer purchasing power
- Protracted market access application process
- Increasing trend to use non-tariff barriers to impede trade
- Sustainability requirements
 - Remain committed to compliance
 - Absence of a common standard, resulting in waste and inefficiencies in the supply chain and moving goalposts are an issue
