Last week we shared a research report with you which was done by GIBS/Stellenbosch/Henley on "Optimising export performance and securing sustainable exporter-importer relationships". An important development with regards to retaining market access is that South Africa has last week requested the establishment of two panels at a meeting of the **Dispute Settlement Body** (DSB) of the **World Trade Organization** (WTO) to examine what, in South Africa's view, are unscientific and discriminatory measures placed on citrus imported from South Africa by the European Union (EU).

These steps were taken to address the EU's regulations on two separate plant health issues: **Citrus Black Spot** (CBS) and **False Codling Moth** (FCM). The regulations are being challenged by the South African government to protect the livelihoods of tens of thousands of people in the local citrus industry.

Value stream mapping with Transnet

We would like to extend a big word of thanks to **Oliver Wood**, the **Managing Director** of the **Ideafruit Group** and his team for hosting the Transnet team as part of the value stream mapping. The aim was to understand the process and drivers behind the packhouse, cold-store and export processes. The Transnet team consisting of **operational staff** that manage the reefer stack, the **planning team** and **Navis team** (booking system) could see and experience how the **apple** packing and export process differs from other fruit types. **Oscar Borchards**, the **Transnet Western Cape Regional Executive** mentioned in an **FTW** (Freight and Trading Weekly) article that the collaboration is an effort to identify opportunities to improve efficiencies. The initiative is in line with the port's commitment to break down silos in the value chain.



Container Terminal Operating Contract

Transnet is committed to keeping shipping lines accountable to the CTOC agreements (Container Terminal Operating Contract) and the goal is to maintain fluidity, turn vessels around and consistent predictable access to market. The contract, for example, allows 10% deviation on volumes but if a vessel wants to load double what has been agreed, it delays other vessel stack dates and follow-up berthing. FPEF via Fruit SA will support the enforcement and we expect better productivity and planning through this initiative.
