Asia Fruit Logistica 2024

The next edition of **Asia Fruit Logistica** returns to **Hong Kong's AsiaWorld-Expo on 4-6 September 2024**. There will be tables available for meetings on a first come, first served basis.



Fruit Attraction Madrid 2024

The next edition of **Fruit Attraction** will take place from **8 to 10 October 2024** at **IFEMA Madrid**. The FPEF will host the National Pavilion together with Fruit South Africa (CGA, Hortgro, SATI and Subtrop). LOGISTICS & OPERATIONS

As previously communicated, the TPT, CTCT (Cape Town Container Terminal) and FPEF worked together with the support of our members, mapping the end-to-end process in the value chain.

Why is this important?

It encourages the sharing of knowledge and collaboration to identify opportunities that enhance efficiency. The deciduous season is fast approaching, and it is essential that we do not only depend on past initiatives to help us export our fruit to market. The process mapping provides us with a baseline to identify the processes that require more investigation.

Where are we now since the start of the initiative?

Our recommendations must translate into practical solutions to ensure efficiency. This aligns with the Operational Excellence Centre's established in TPT with the sole purpose to enhance efficiencies.

Certainly, we need the guidance of a variety of experts to steer us in the right direction. This initiative relates to the technical support offered by business (through the NLCC) and the partnership with Transnet, especially TPT. Continuous improvement on operational level, is complementary to the NLCC's technical support for maintenance at the ports.
