Due the Covid pandemic and worldwide measures to try and mitigate the spread of the virus, various events had to be cancelled, postponed or be changed to a virtual format. Others will take place, but it is not possible for South Africans to participate due to travel restrictions and requirements of the host country. Such an example is Fruit Attraction in Madrid in October where South Africans would be required to be in quarantine on arrival for 10 days.

Our applications for access to new markets and/or revised protocols, are still being hampered by Covid-19 measures. We were thus pleased to have received the revised protocol for **lemons** being exported to **China**. The core element of the revision is the temperature/time regime. The cold treatment regime, to mitigate fruit flies entails that fruit pulp temperature of 3.0°C or below be maintained for a minimum uninterrupted exposure time of eighteen (18) consecutive days. Fruit must be pre-cooled in approved cold store facilities to the target temperature. Loading of the fruit can only commence when the target temperature of 3.0°C or colder has been recorded.



One of the biggest challenges remain logistics; especially with regards to ports, container availability and cold room capacity. We are participating in various forums, committees and meetings with stakeholders where solutions for these constraints are sought.
